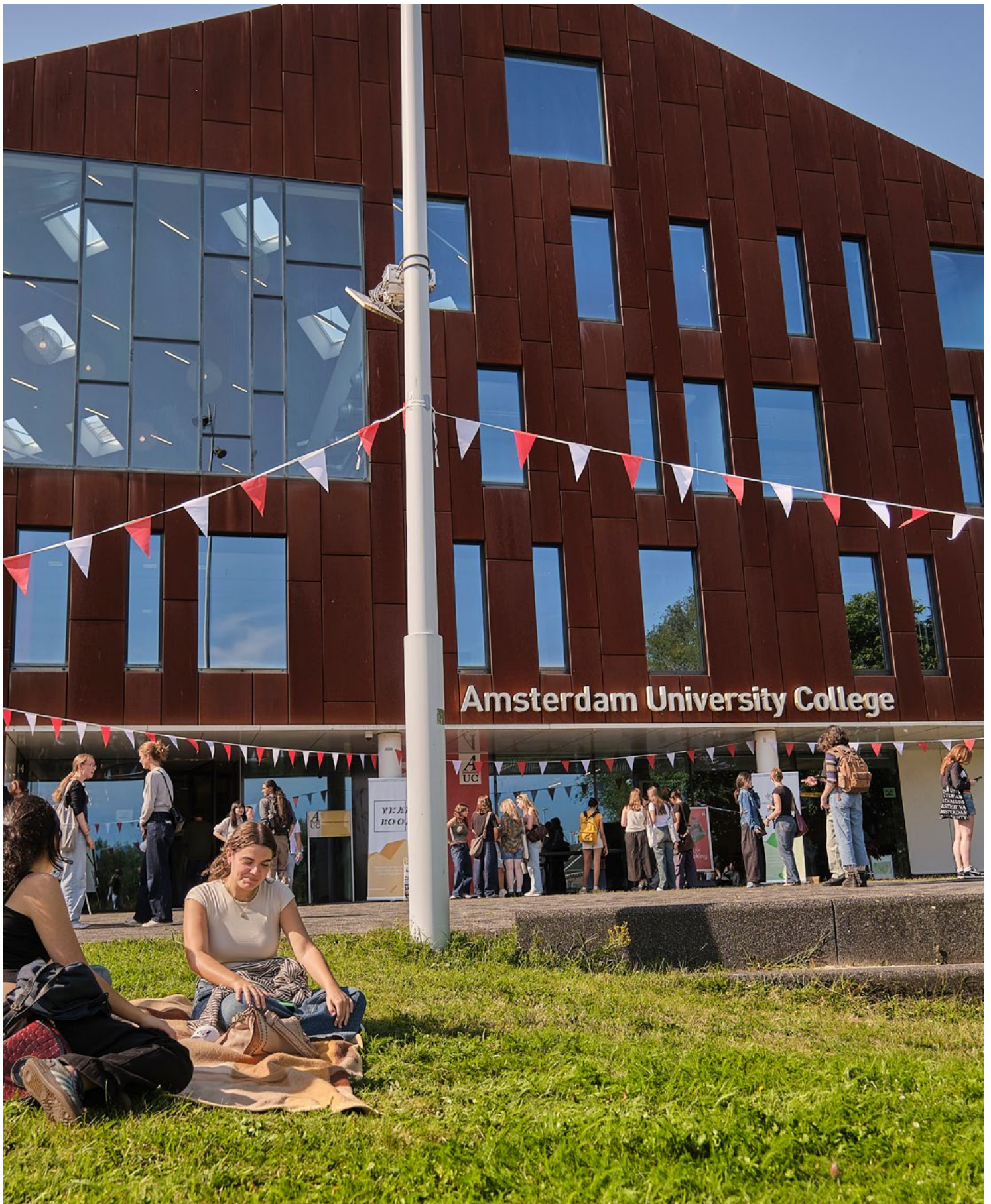

# About AUC



## **BRIEF FACTS**

Amsterdam University College (AUC) is a joint initiative of the University of Amsterdam and VU Amsterdam. We offer a small-scale and intensive liberal arts and sciences programme taught entirely in English.

## **EDUCATION**

AUC is designed for students eager to tackle global challenges. Rooted in the American liberal arts tradition but enriched by a European perspective, AUC provides a dynamic learning environment where small class sizes, interactive teaching and close faculty engagement foster critical thinking and intellectual curiosity. With a curriculum spanning Sciences, Social Sciences and Humanities, students have the flexibility to tailor their studies while benefiting from a strong academic foundation (Academic Core) and research opportunities.

Located in Amsterdam East, AUC's residential campus forms the heart of our community. The programme emphasises real-world application, encouraging students to engage with pressing societal issues through internships, research and community projects. Whether focusing on sustainability, health, artificial intelligence, international relations or another global issue, students gain the analytical skills and perspective needed to thrive in today's interconnected world.

## **STUDENT SUPPORT**

AUC offers a variety of services for students related to health, safety and well-being.

### *AUC's tutoring system*

# Academics



## **COURSE INFORMATION**

Exchange students may participate in all courses offered by AUC. Courses are coded by major (Academic Core, Sciences, Social Sciences and Humanities) and by level (100, 200 and 300). Courses may have entry requirements. Students who wish to take a course with an entry requirement must have completed a course similar to the entry requirement in order to take the course of choice. Not all courses are offered in every semester. It is important to determine if a course is taught in the semester you'll be on exchange. Also take into account that semester changes do occasionally occur over the year and the new course catalogue won't be published until after you apply to AUC. Exchange students at AUC can only take courses offered by AUC, as UvA and VU courses lead to timetable clashes. All courses at AUC start with code 900. ## **COURSE REGISTRATION**

Course registration takes place in May for the Autumn semester and in November for the Spring semester. Exchange students will be informed about course registration procedures after acceptance and will get access to the online course registration portal to select their preferred courses. Confirmation of course enrolment will be given in June (Autumn semester) or December (Spring semester).

## **PRIORITY OF ENROLMENT**

Please note that we **cannot** guarantee courses. AUC courses have a maximum capacity of 25 students. If a course attracts more students than there are places, students enrolled in the AUC degree programme will be given priority over exchange students.

## **LANGUAGE COURSES**

AUC offers intensive (contextualising) language courses in January and June for all AUC students. Languages offered include Spanish, French, German, Dutch, Chinese and Arabic.

The Institute for Dutch as a Second Language (INTT) also organises Dutch language courses for exchange students. Students interested in taking part in one of the courses should visit the website of the INTT. AUC exchange students are eligible for a special reduced fee for courses taken at the INTT. Upon successful completion of the course students will receive a certificate of completion, but the course will not count towards the AUC credits. ## **ACADEMIC CALENDAR**

The AUC academic calendar is divided into two semesters. Each semester is then subsequently divided into one period of 16 weeks and one period of four weeks. Students complete four courses of 6 European Credits (EC) each during the 16-week period and one course of 6 EC over the four-week period. It is possible to 'overload' and take 5 courses (i.e. 30 EC) during the 16-week period for students who wish to leave early but need to complete a full workload.

## **COURSE LOAD**

AUC uses the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). A full study workload consists of 30 EC per semester, split into 16-week and 4-week periods as defined below:

- 16-week period: 24 EC (4 courses)
- 4-week period: 6 EC (1 course)

Courses offered by AUC count for 6 EC. The AUC credit system is based on “student workload”. Student workload involves not only lectures and seminars, but also self-study. Students are required to attend class from 12 to 16 hours per week and spend an additional 28 to 32 hours per week engaging in self-study. The minimum required course load for exchange students is 24 EC. Students wishing to take less than 24 EC will need written permission from their home university.

## **ASSESSMENT**

Students at AUC are graded per course on a 1-10 grading scale. Students must achieve a grade of 6.0 or higher in order to pass a course.

## **GRADING**

The educational style at AUC strives to train students to be independent, take initiative and invest in their studies and research. Grading and credits are organised in accord with national and European systems. In the Netherlands, students are expected to take on a high level of individual responsibility and initiative. AUC especially encourages students to develop an independent and critical way of thinking. ## **LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION**

With the exception of language courses (e.g. Dutch, French, Spanish, German, Chinese, Arabic), all courses at AUC are taught in English.

## **ON-CAMPUS ACCOMMODATION**

AUC is a residential college, meaning that all AUC students live together in the AUC student residences. AUC aims to include all exchange students in its housing programme. While it is very likely we’ll be able to offer on-campus housing to incoming exchange students, it cannot be guaranteed, as

placement depends on availability. Approximately two months before the start of the exchange semester, you will be informed whether you can be accommodated on campus.

Exchange students who are placed in AUC housing are, by default, offered shared double-occupancy rooms. Due to capacity constraints and limited availability, alternative room types cannot be guaranteed. Students are only permitted to live off campus if no rooms are available in the AUC student residences. The partial residential campus fee for exchange students is 325 EUR, paid once. # Immigration



## **STUDENT VISA**

Citizens of European Union member states, EEA, Australia, Canada, Japan, South Korea, New Zealand, the UK and the USA do not need an entry visa to enter the Netherlands.

All other students must apply for a visa called "*Machtiging tot Voorlopig Verblijf*" (MVV) in order to enter the Netherlands. Your visa is a sticker in your passport issued by the Dutch Embassy or Consulate. The purpose of this sticker is to allow you to travel to and enter the Netherlands. For actually staying and studying in the Netherlands, you will also need a residence permit.

## **RESIDENCE PERMIT**

All students (except citizens of European Union member states and EEA states) need to apply for a residence permit in order to study in the Netherlands for a period longer than three months. A residence permit is called a "*Vergunning Verblijf Regulier* (VVR)" and this is a permit that allows you to legally reside in the Netherlands. It is issued for a specific purpose and, in your case, that is to study.

Student Services at the University of Amsterdam ([uvastudentservices@uva.nl](mailto:uvastudentservices@uva.nl)) will inform students about their personal immigration procedure and guide them through the online process of obtaining a visa and residence permit. # Health insurance



## **UNIVERSITY HEALTH SERVICE**

International students enrolled at AUC are entitled to use the [University of Amsterdam Student Medical Service](#) free of charge if they are properly insured. In other cases, access to the Student Medical Service requires an annual fee or payment per consultation. These fees do not cover the cost of prescriptions. Students should check with their insurance company on how medical costs are reimbursed.

International students from European countries can request a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) from their home country, which simplifies the procedure when receiving medical assistance during their stay in a European Union member state.

## **INSURANCE**

Health insurance is mandatory by Dutch law. AUC also strongly recommends students take out an appropriate general third-party insurance (liability insurance). For non-EEA/EU students requesting a residence permit through the University of Amsterdam, liability insurance is mandatory. If students have plans to travel outside of the Netherlands, they should make sure that their insurance policy covers those regions as well.

Students should check whether their insurance will cover the complete period of their stay abroad and what type of coverage it consists of before arriving in the Netherlands. For more information on the type of insurance required based on country of citizenship, please visit the Nuffic website:

# Application



## PROCEDURES

AUC/UvA will send nomination instructions to the home university of the exchange candidate. The home university nominates their student in the University of Amsterdam (UvA) online nomination portal at least two weeks before the application deadline. After AUC accepts the nomination, the student will receive a UvAnetID (student number) and an invitation to start the online application.

## APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS:

1. UvA will send two emails:
  - The first email will contain instructions on how to apply.
  - The second email will be sent within one working day after the first email and will include your UvAnetID (student number).
2. Activate your UvAnetID as instructed in the second email.
3. Once you have carefully read the information in the AUC fact sheet, and you have activated your UvAnetID, you can go to the SIS student portal via the link provided in the first email. Log in with your UvAnetID and click on 'My Admissions' to submit your application.
4. Please note that you will need to upload the following documents in PDF format with your study abroad application in the SIS student portal:
  - Motivation letter
  - Curriculum Vitae/Resume
  - Official transcript(s) in English of all university courses/examinations you have taken including the credits and grades obtained
  - List of courses in progress
  - Scan of passport or ID card (front and back)
  - Proof of English proficiency (see the section on entry requirements below for acceptable proofs of English proficiency)
5. Submit your application in the SIS student portal before the given deadline. Once we have evaluated and accepted your application, you will receive further information about course registration, housing and immigration procedures.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Students must have completed at least 1,5 years of studies/90 ECTS (or the equivalent in local credits) at the time of departure for study abroad.
- Students should have a grade point average of **at least 3.0** (out of 4.0) and a relevant academic background in the proposed field of study. See also above for how a 3.0 GPA is translated into percentages. For 1-10 grading scales, 7 is the minimum requirement.
- Proof of English proficiency (one of the items below is required):
  - ◊ IELTS: overall score of 7.0 (with at least 6.5 in each of the four components)
  - ◊ TOEFL: overall score of 100 (with a minimum sub-score of 24 for reading and writing, 22 for listening and 25 for speaking).
  - ◊ Cambridge: C1 Advanced (with a minimum score of 190)
